ANGUS TOP TEN RULES (REVISED 30 MARCH 1999)

1. The Angus Top Ten Competition is played between Singles, Pairs, Triples and Fours from each Club.
2. The form of the play shall be: Singles 21 Shots, Pairs 17 Ends, Triples 15 Ends, Fours 17 Ends
3. Rinks must be drawn in the presence of the visiting team.
4. The outcome of the match shall be decided on a points system as follows:
 - 4.1 Two points will be awarded to each winning rink.
 - 4.2 One point will be awarded to each drawn rink.
 - 4.3 In the event of both teams being equal on points, the team with the highest number of shots will be deemed the winning team.
 - 4.4 In the event of both teams being equal on points and shots, the winning team will be the one which won the singles.
5. If owing to any reason a game shall be postponed, the game shall be played on an agreed date prior to the next round taking place. Failing agreement by both Clubs, a date shall be arranged by the Secretary of the Association which shall be conclusive.
6. Should the game be stopped by mutual agreement or by the official umpire, it shall be resumed at a date prior to the next round with the scores as they were when the stoppage took place. If however, eleven ends or more have been played in the four events, the result of the game will be decided on the score at the eleventh or subsequent ends. All rinks must complete the same number of ends.
7. An incomplete team will automatically be disqualified.
8. Up to the Semi-Final, games will commence at 6.30 p.m. and Semi-Final and Final will commence at 2 p.m. on a Sunday. Fifteen minutes waiting time will be allowed in each case.
9. Scores should be telephoned to the Secretary and score cards forwarded as soon as possible thereafter.
